

### CONTEST DAY

Contest Day will be held at 6 p.m., June 7, 2019. It is a public speaking event open to all 4-H members, including Cloverbuds. Contest Day is a great way to build public speaking skills that will benefit youth in school, job interviews, and throughout life. This event is the first step in the process of being named Most Outstanding 4-H'er. Registrations are due May 31, and are accepted from 4-H advisors only.



### Contest Day Will Include:

- The first of only two options to complete the required Live Skill-A-Thon for those vying for MO4-H'er and
  Most Outstanding Exhibitor. The MO4-H'er application or for MOE an up-to-date Ohio Achievement
  Record Form must be turned in to your 4 H Club advisor for submission to the Extension office with the
  club's Contest Day participants. All forms must be received in the Jefferson County OSU Extension office
  by May 31! No late registrations will be accepted in an effort to be fair to all!

### PROJECT JUDGING DAY

# CONTEST DAY INTERVIEW EVENTS

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES:**

Each participant will be interviewed by a judge for 5-7minutes. The interview will focus on information related to that particular event, knowledge of 4-H and 4-H activities. The top 3 individuals in each event will be placed.

Species Achievement Awards (rabbit, small animal, swine, horse, dog, goat, poultry, beef, dairy and sheep):
This is the 1st step if you would like to compete for Most Outstanding Exhibitor Awards for 2019.

Each species achievement participant must have an UP-TO-DATE, COMPLETED OHIO 4-H ACHIEVEMENT RECORD, including a 4-H STORY (250 word minimum) to the OSU Extension Office by May 31th. A sample of the Achievement Record is included in this packet, BUT members must type the form. No handwritten forms will be accepted. Check out the fillable form @ jefferson.osu.edu.

Participants will have an opportunity to talk with a judge about their project. Emphasis of interview will be on: knowledge of animal species, care of the animal, knowledge of 4-H and 4-H activities.

Must be currently enrolled in the project in which they are applying, have currently completed one year in 4-H and participated in last year's skill-a-thon for that species.

Members competing for MOE (Most Outstanding Exhibitor) Awards will receive their Contest Day raw score as points toward their MOE total score for participating in this event.

Junior Division - 8-13 years of age

(All ages are as of January 1st of current year)

Most Outstanding Exhibitor Awards are given to the member with the highest number of points when you total the following: Contest Day interview score, mandatory live skill-a-thon score, attendance at a clinic in the specie's project area, class placing and showmanship placing at the County Fair.

LIVE SKILL-A-THON WILL BE AVAILABLE AT CONTEST DAY ONLY FOR THOSE YOUTH TURNING IN MO4-H'er APPLICATIONS or OHIO 4-H ACHIEVEMENT FORMS FOR THE PURPOSE OF MOE COMPETITION TO THE OSUE OFFICE BY MAY 31. SCORES WILL NOT BE IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE. SCORES WILL BE MAILED AND THE PARTICIPANT CONTACTED, AFTER GRADING IS COMPLETE, THE FOLLOWING MONDAY.

If there is a tie, the member who places highest in the supreme showmanship class wins the award.

# CONTEST DAY PUBLIC SPEAKING EVENTS

### **GENERAL GUIDELINES:**

Each participant/team will present his/her/their speech or demonstration before a judge. The top 3 individuals or teams in each competitive event will be placed.

When members of a team fall into different age categories, they must participate in Sr. Division.

- 1. Pledge/Creed Events—These events are non-competitive and are open to Cloverbuds. See Creed/ Pledge sheet. All participants will receive a certificate for their achievement. This is a county only event.
- 2. Health & Safety Speaking Contest—This includes an Individual Public Speaking Contest and a Health & Safety Team Talk/Skit Contest. There are three age divisions. There is a regional competition held June 28, 2019, at the 4-H Center in Columbus. First place winners qualify to attend, this regional competition. The state competition will be held at the Rhodes Center in Columbus July 24.
- **3. Demonstrations or Illustrated Talks**—This contest is a straight to state event. There are two age divisions. These individuals are eligible to participate in Communication Days at the 4-H Youth Center Wednesday July 31, or Thursday, Aug. 1.

(Achievement Record is not needed for these three above stated types of events.)

Each of the above have additional instructions.

# Illustrated talk or demonstration without use of computer technology J-1 Junior Individual (age 8-10) J-2 Junior Team (age 8-10)

- The presenter uses appropriate props and other visual aides to teach others about a subject or how to do something.
- May use charts, posters or pictures to deliver their Illustrated Talk or to stress points within their Demonstration
- PowerPoint or computer generated messages are not used in these classes.
- Presenters are evaluated on their ability to convey information and teach on a particular topic. See score sheet for more information on areas of evaluation.
- Presentations should be 5-7 minutes in length. Scores are lowered for presentations over or under time limits.

## Illustrated Talks or Demonstrations with or without the use of computer technology

- The presenter uses appropriate props, posters, and/or computer generated visual aides to teach
  others about a particular topic, practice, procedure, scientific principle or phenomenon. Use of computer generated visuals is NOT required. Examples:
  - \* A demonstration may be delivered in this category. PowerPoint type slides may be add ed in addition to other props to help present their message.
  - \* An Illustrated Talk may be delivered in this category, with the member(s) using Power Point type technology to present all or part of the visual mess age: must be accompanied by I live parration.
- Requires live speech delivered along with any PowerPoint or poster message. (No pre-recorded narration.)
- Presentations are evaluated on the members' communication skills and their ability to effectively use technology, posters or other props to enhance their Illustrated Talk or Demonstration.
- Presentations should be 8-10 minutes in length.
- Scores are lowered for presentations over or under time limits.

# Health/Safety Speaking Contest Individual Or Team (Jr. & Sr. Divisions) Junior Division - 8-13 years of age Senior Division - 14-19 years of age (All ages are as of January 1st of current year)

- Each contestant must bring to the event, a legibly written or typed copy of their talk.
- Contestants are to select a topic on human health or safety that affects family living, whether it is in the home, on the farm, on the highway, or in public places. A local example and supporting statistics, with sources cited, are required.
- Speeches should be written/prepared by 4-H member giving speech. Music, singing, and dances can NOT be included. Contestants who do so will be penalized five points.
- Senior contestants speeches are to be 4.0 to 5.5 minutes in length. Junior speeches are 2.5 3.5 minute. There will be a 10 point deduction for a time difference in speech length.
- There will be no time allotted or credit given for questions from the audience.
- Prompters, scripts, note cards, verbal clues, signaling and /or props may not be used when the
- Contestant is speaking. No visual aids or props are permitted.
- Trademark or brand name of products should not be mentioned in the skit. Gestures should be used carefully and minimally.
- · Verbal profanity is forbidden. Note cards are no permitted.
- Appropriate dress (including shoes) is required for all 4-H Public Speaking participants. The use of costumes will NOT be permitted. There is a five point deduction for dress and show infractions.
- Microphones are not used on the local level. However, will be used on the state level.
- Judges will evaluate team on following criteria: 30% content; 30% organization; 40% delivery.
   Refer to score sheet.

### PUBLIC SPEAKING CONTINUED

Health Skits Team

Jr. & Sr. Divisions

Junior Division - 8-13 years of age

Senior Division - 14-19 years of age

(All ages are as of January 1st of current year)

- Each team must consist of two to five current 4-H members.
- Each team must bring to the event a legibly written or typed summary of their skit. Team talks/skits should be created/prepared by the 4-H members participating in the team talk/skit.
- Teams are to select a topic of human health or safety that effects family living whether it is in the home, on the farm, on the highway or in public places. Team talks/skits should be created/prepared by the 4-H members participating in the team talk/skit. A local example & supporting statistics (with sources cited) are required.
- The time limited for each team shall be 5-8 minutes. Each member of the team must participate with at least one minute of speaking time. Teams going over/under the stated time limit or not meeting the speaking time requirement will be penalized 10 points. There will be no time allotted or credit given for questions from the audience.
- Prompter, scripts, verbal coaching and note cards may not be used during the skit. Props may be
  used for the team talks/skits, but no posters or printed materials will be allowed. Trademarked or
  "Brand Names" of products should not be used on props, costumes mentioned in the skit. Live animals are not considered props and are not permitted.
- Appropriate dress is required for all 4-H skit participants. The use of costumes will be allowed as long as all participants are fully clothed and wearing shoes. Verbal profanity is prohibited, including clothing.
- Microphones will not be used at the local level, however, will be used at the state level.
- Judges will evaluate team on following criteria: 30% content; 30% organization; 20% visual delivery 20% vocal delivery. Refer to score sheet.

### MARKETING DIVISION EVENTS

Entries for these new events must be submitted to OSUE by May 31st.

A member may only enter one marketing division class.

### J-7 Junior Individual age 8-10 Thank You Card WITHOUT the use of computer graphics or scrapbooking tools.

## J-8 Junior Individual age 8-10 Thank you Card WITH the use of computer graphics or scrapbooking tools

- This should be an original "thank you" card with artwork on the cover and an optional verse or message inside thanking a business, individual or others for their support of
   4-H. An inside message is not required. The 4-H emblem is strongly encouraged.
- · Only one entry per member
- Card should be on 8 1/2 x 11 cardstock, folded once.
- Art and message must be the original work of the member.
- Member may use any medium, including crayon, chalk, pen and ink, pencil, markers, etc.
- No use of computers or scrapbooking tools in the creation of entries in class J-7. Designs must be hand lettered, drawn, or cut by hand.
- Unless the 4-H emblem is drawn by hand, the entry must go into the graphic division J-8.
- Artwork or lettering created with the aid of scrapbooking tools or computers in permitted in J-8 provided the design is original artwork of the member. No commercially designed clipart may be used.
- These designs must be able to be duplicated.

### **Marketing Division Continued**

- Member's name, age and county should be neatly printed in the lower right-hand corner of the back of the card.
- Evaluation will be based on the quality, creativity and originality of the design.
- By submitting an entry you give the Ohio 4-H Foundation the right to use select cards as the Ohio 4-H Foundation's official thank you cards for 2019. The cards will display the 4-H member's first name/age/ county.

## J-9 Intermediate Individual (age 11-13) - Holiday Card WITHOUT the use of computer graphics or scrapbooking tools

## J-10 Intermediate Individual (age 11-13) - Holiday Card WITH the use of computer graphics or scrapbooking tools

- This should be an original "Holiday" card with artwork on the cover. An inside message is not required, but may be included at the discretion of the designer. Inside messages will not be judged.
   Use of the 4-H emblem is strongly encouraged, but not required.
- Card should be on 8 1/2 x 11 white cardstock, folded in half. (Only 1 fold).
- Art and message must be the original work of the member.
- Member may use any medium, including crayon, chalk, pen and ink, pencil, markers, etc. No use of computers or scrapbooking tools in creating entries in class J-9.
   Designs must be hand lettered, drawn or cut.
- When using 4-H logo that is downloaded, it must go into the graphics division.
- Artwork or lettering created with the aid of scrapbooking tools or computers is permitted in J-10
  provided the design is an original artwork of the member. No commercial designed clip art is allowed.
- These designs must be able to be duplicated.
- Member's name, age and county should be neatly printed in the lower right-hand corner of the back of the card.
- Evaluation will be based on the quality, creativity and originality of the design.
- By submitting an entry, you give the 4-H Foundation the rights to use the chosen cards as the 4-H
  Foundation's official Holiday Cards for 2019. The cards will display the 4-H member's first name,
  age, and county.

### J-11 Senior Individual (age 14 and up) - 4-H Infomercial Promoting 4-H

- This is a video "short" that promotes 4-H program.
- This must be a fully automated, stand-alone video presentation with sound and narration as appropriate. Think "YouTube." The video should include recorded visual, sound and narration to convey a message.
- The video should be the original work of the member making the entry.
- Images in the video should be appropriate for promoting 4-H. Use of pictures of youth who are 4-H
  age; when possible, show the diversity of membership, projects, and activities; show youth exercising appropriate safety practices.
- The video should be 2-4 minutes long. Penalties will be assessed for videos less than 2 minutes or longer than 4 minutes.
- Videos must be submitted on a DVD, flash drive, or posted as an unlisted video on You Tube. Unlisted videos must be shared with the State 4-H office by sending a link via email to Sally McClaskey at (mcclaskey.12@osu.edu.) The video must play using QuickTime Player or Windows Media Player.
- The member's name, age and county must be neatly written on the DVD, along with the presentation title.
- Evaluations will be based on the quality and originality of the message, as well as on the creative and professional use of technology. Videos should persuade the viewer to action.

### OTHER CONTEST DAY OPPORTUNITIES...

### **CLOVERBUD ACTIVITIES (Registration is attached)**

Special Cloverbud activities will be offered on Contest Day. Each Cloverbud is asked to bring an old shoe or boot. We are asking for one advisor or parent to assist with this activity with the Cloverbuds from your club. Cloverbud participants will recite the pledge/creed as a group and plant their boot. These are the only Cloverbud activities at this event.

### **MOST OUTSTANDING 4-H'ER**

Most Outstanding 4-H'er applications must be received by May 31st at the Jefferson County OSUE office. Live skill-a-thon will be available at Contest Day for those individuals meeting this dead-line. Applications are included in this packet and located on the Facebook page for download.

#### OTHER REQUIREMENTS FOR MOST OUTSTANDING 4-H'er:

- 1.) A completed achievement forms due on September 15th and including 2019 information.
- 2.) Gold Honor Member Form submitted by September 15th (Gold is mandatory for anyone going for Most Outstanding 4-H'er status.)
- 3.) Interview in Late September.

# Points to Remember When Working on your Photo Page (Developed by Lisa McCutcheon, 4-H Educator, Licking County)

- ◆You want to choose only a few photos. No fewer than four or five should be used. There is no maximum number, but use common sense. Do not use a collage of photos—it just isn't professional.
- The photos that you choose should represent your entire tenure within 4-H project work. Choose a few from your younger years, and a few that are recent. Just be sure that the photos relate DIRECTLY to the project area that you are applying to receive recognition.
- You want the judge to be able to see photos clearly, and color is best if possible. You can either have reprints made, or simply have color copies made of original photos. Also remember to trim photos when appropriate.
- Remember to label the photos so the judge will understand what is being done in the photo. It is important they realize what the award was you were presented, or how old the member was you were mentoring, or that you are feeding a flock of animals that you have purchased and cared for yourself. Details help the judge to understand the breadth of your involvement.
- There are obviously a number of ways that are appropriate to arrange photos on a photo page. Just be sure they are displayed neatly, in color, with labels, and are easy to see (not too dark, too bright, or blurry), and that they relate to your 4-H project work.
- Do not include photos that depict you doing Girl Scout/Boy Scout/FFA/etc activities. Remember that we want your photo page to portray your accomplishments and growth through 4-H Youth Development programs.
